## Occupy Labor Law - What Labor Can Learn

The relationship between Occupy Wall Street and Occupy Movements across the country and organized • labor was complicated at first. There was the initial tension, occupy thought labor was going to co-opt them. Occupy turned down support from political parties as well. Labor said "we just want to make their message louder" and the forces were joined.

What lessons can labor learn from the street actions of OWS? Can labor become more aggressive in their messaging and activity? Can labor return to the days of non-violent civil disobedience? Should they? Will Constitutional arguments regarding speech and assembly be the new "weapons" of labor?
