<b>Thursday Oct 22 7 pm - 8:45 pm</b>	<b>KEYNOTE by Alicia Garza</b>	Alicia Garza is the Special Projects Director for the National Domestic Workers Alliance (NDWA). She has been the recipient of multiple awards for her organizing work in Black and Latino communities, including her work fighting gentrification and environmental racism in San Francisco's largest remaining Black community. Alicia joined the NDWA after serving as Executive Director of People Organized to Win Employment Rights (POWER) in San Francisco since 2009. In 2013, Alicia co-founded #BlackLivesMatter, an online platform developed after the murder of Trayvon Martin, designed to connect people interested in learning more about and fighting back against anti-Black racism.
